Objectives of 2nd JADECARE Stakeholder Forum

JADECARE (Joint Action on implementation of Digitally Enabled integrated person-centred CARE) will contribute to innovative, efficient and sustainable health systems through providing expertise to assist European countries in undertaking health system reforms. It will enable national authorities to benefit from efficient solutions in digitally enabled integrated person-centred care. The main objectives are to reinforce the capacity of health authorities to successfully address important aspects of health system transformation, in particular the transition to digitally-enabled, integrated, person-centred care and to support best practice transfer from systems of "early adopters" to the ones of the "next adopters". This Joint action involves the Competent Authorities of 16 Member States and 29 Affiliated Entities.

The Stakeholder Forums of JADECARE are intended to facilitate the exchange of experience and productive networking between the organizations participating in JADECARE and relevant Stakeholders.

To this mean, external Stakeholders, including health system representatives, researchers and academia interested in collaborating with the JA are encouraged to discuss the current status and achievements of JADE-CARE, emerging problems, but also further ideas, solutions and networking possibilities. Also, key health care industries/developers are invited to contribute on how to enhance competitiveness and economic growth opportunities of EU industry.

"Implementation of digitally enabled integrated person-centred care – Roll out and Learnings"
